Helen Keller

- Born on June 27, 1880 in Alabama
- She was the first deaf-blind person to earn a Bachelor of Arts degree
- American author, political activist, and lecturer



Challenge: loss of sight and hearing

 In 1882, an illness, which called "brain fever," struck her and left her blind and deaf



Society Influences

- Her instructor: Anne Sullivan
 - Keller's mentor during her youth
 - Helped Keller make the connection between objects and letters
 - This was an important step for Keller to achieve her future outcomes



Inspirational Acts of Resiliency

In 1946, Keller was appointed counselor of international relations for the

American Foundation of Overseas Blind.

 Between 1946 and 1957, she traveled to 35 countries on five continents.

- In 1955, at age 75, Keller travelled a 40,000 miles trek across Asia.
- Through her many speeches and appearances, she brought inspiration and encouragement to millions of people.



Influence On Others

 During her remarkable life, Keller stood as a strong example of how hard work and imagination can allow an individual to triumph over adversity

Keller wrote her autobiography The Story of My Life, which influenced millions

of people about her hard work and resiliency.



Honor

- the Theodore Roosevelt Distinguished Service Medal in 1936
- the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1964, and election to the Women's Hall of Fame in 1965
- honorary doctoral degrees from Temple University, Harvard University and many other universities. Additionally, she was named an Honorary Fellow of the Educational Institute of Scotland.
