- THREATENING



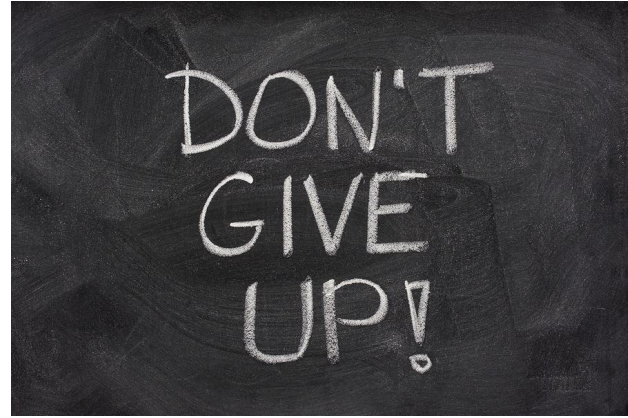
HOW DID SOCIETY INFLUENCE HER

- SOCIAL DISCRIMINATION



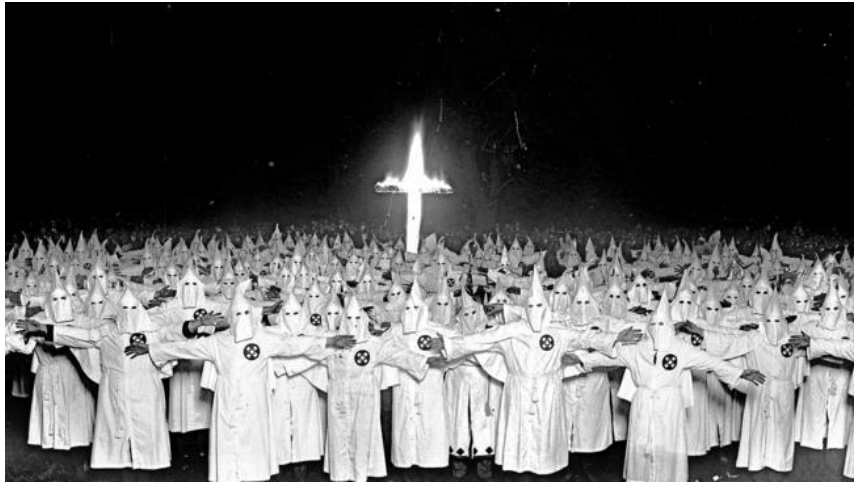
WHAT ACTIONS DID/DOES SHE TAKE THAT MAKE HER RESILIENT?
